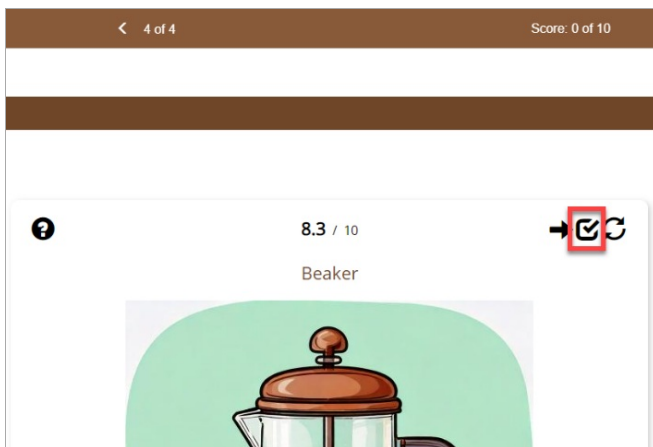
Completed Activity

If the activity has been completed, then the activity score is added to the lesson score.



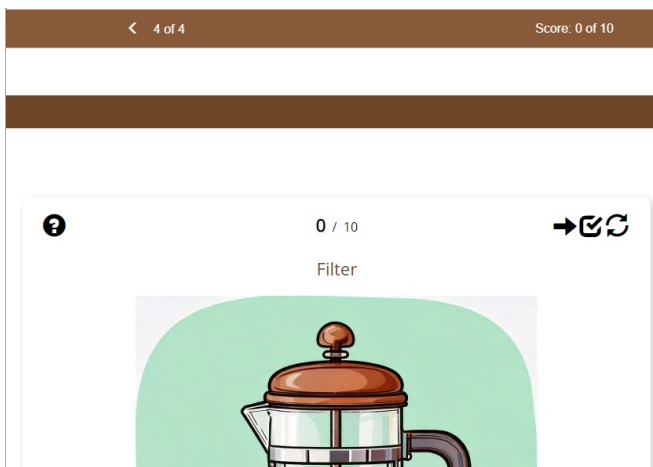
Partially Completed Activity

Incomplete Activity

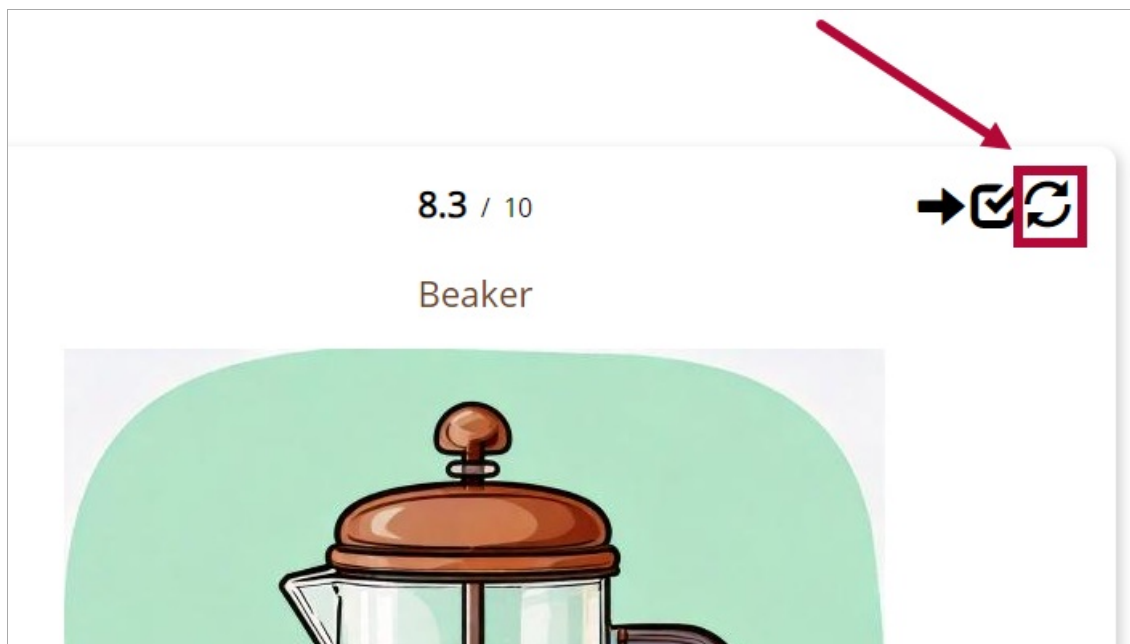
For incomplete activities, you will not be awarded any points.
